Eloy Vera was first elected to the office of Starr County Judge in 1998 and has been consistently re-elected since then, often facing opponents at the ballot box. However, he has no Campaign Treasurer Appointment on file (as required by Election Code 252.001), has made expenditures without a campaign treasurer on file (in violation of Election Code 253.031(a)), and has continually failed to file campaign finance reports (in violation of Election Code 254.041(a)(1)) despite raising and spending funds to facilitate his re-elections.

Vera has faced opponents in 2014, 2018, and 2022. Throughout that time, Vera has disregarded the state's campaign finance reporting requirements, denying the public information as to who supported his campaign and who he paid using campaign funds. Neither the Starr County Clerk nor the Starr County Elections Administrator have a campaign treasurer appointment or any campaign finance reports relating to Vera's electoral activity (see Texas Election Code 252.005).

In the 2014 Democratic primary, Vera defeated two challengers - Lupe Amador and Guillermo Gonzalez, Jr. However, there are no campaign finance reports on file with the local filing authority, indicating that Vera failed to file the required disclosures. This indicates a failure to comply with Election Code Sections 254.063 and 254.064.

In the 2018 Democratic primary, Vera defeated Letty Garza-Galvan (the outcome of which was subject to an election contest). Again, there are no campaign finance reports on file with the local filing authority, indicating that Vera failed to file the required reports. This indicates a failure to comply with Election Code Sections 254.063 and 254.064.

In the 2022 election cycle, Vera faces a general election opponent. As indicated by the attached exhibits, Vera is actively campaigning for re-election. Vera does not currently have a campaign treasurer appointment on file with the local filing authority, and has not filed semi-annual reports in January 2021, July 2021, or January 2022 (as required by Election Code 254.063).

Therefore, I allege the following statutory violations within the preceding two years:

- Making expenditure without campaign treasurer on file (Election Code 252.001)
- 2. Failure to file July 2020 semi-annual report (Election Code 254.063)
- 3. Failure to file January 2021 semi-annual report (Election Code 254.063)
- 4. Failure to file July 2021 semi-annual report (Election Code 254.063)
- 5. Failure to file January 2022 semi-annual report (Election Code 254.063)

Neither the Starr County Clerk nor the Starr County Elections Administrator have a campaign treasurer appointment or any campaign finance reports relating to Vera's electoral activity (see Texas Election Code 252.005).

News media indicated the purchase of at least one political billboard (which was installed without permission on private property).

In the 2022 election cycle, Vera faces general election opponent Maria Yvette Hernandez. As indicated by the attached exhibits, Vera is actively campaigning for re-election. Vera does not currently have a campaign treasurer appointment on file with the local filing authority, and has not filed semi-annual reports in January 2021, July 2021, or January 2022 (as required by Election Code 254.063).

At least two public information requests have sought copies of Vera's CTA and campaign finance reports from the Starr County Elections Administrator; that office has responded to two separate requests that no such information is on file.
